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Overview

Mohamed H. Mr. Nabulsi has set precedent in healthcare litigation including a landmark victory before the United States Court of Appeals for the 3rd Circuit against GEICO. Mr. Nabulsi is at the forefront of litigation involving the federal NSA and the IDR process.
